



Dorothy Knappenberger

A scholarship was established in memory of Dorothy Lavina Knappenberger, who died August 8, 1997. She was born March 31, 1906 in Monroe, PA. At the age of 9, she moved to Keifer, OK.

She attended and graduated from Sapulpa High School. She then received her Associate Degree from Stephens College, a Bachelor's degree from the University of Missouri and a Master's degree from Columbia University. She taught English in Altus, OK before coming to work for Tulsa Public Schools for 41 years. She taught at Roosevelt Junior High before teaching at Webster High School, where she was Senior Class Sponsor for many years. The last 15 years she was head of all English in the Secondary Schools of the Tulsa Public Schools.

She was a Phi Beta Kappa and Chi Omega. She was a loyal and committed member of First Presbyterian Church, where she had been a Deaconess, Elder and Sunday School Teacher. She was also a member of the Pilot Club, Kappa Kappa Iota, Delta Kappa Gamma, Retired Teachers Assoc., A.A.U.W., Docent at Gilcrease Museum and was active in R.S.V.P.
